A.	Literacy skills, particularly in reading and writing, are lower for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium than for other pupils.
B.	Historic variability in the quality of teaching, particularly in reading and writing, has led to gaps in attainment of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium in particular year groups.
C.	Effectiveness of supporting SEND pupils who are eligible for Pupil Premium, has led to gaps in attainment of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium in particular year groups.
