We will then plan a range of interactive learning activities, based around these texts.

It is also useful to teaching staff and parents/carers for sending quick messages and reminders to one another about each individual child. Reading and language

In Duckling Class, we believe it is really important that there is a wide range of books available to the children. Looking at and discussing the pictures is a way in which the children are able to verbalise their interpretations of the story, which also builds on their language and communication skills. Therefore, we encourage parents to allow children the opportunity to ask questions and make comments on the pictures. By reading to children, we are modelling the reading process to them, which will support their early reading skills, in preparation for reception. We will be following the Letters & Sounds phonics programme, focusing upon Phase 1, which involves listening in a wider environment and discriminating between sounds.
