## Reading Racetrack

Please ensure that when you read with your child, you make a record of this in their reading log. We then check this weekly and make a record of how many reads each child in Robin Class is completing and this is counted towards a total percentage for each class. The class with the highest percentage of children who have read 3 times or more will be announced in assembly. For each read they complete, they will also move up our reading racetrack. There are milestone prizes and prizes for the children who accumulate the most reads in the class!
