

## **Westfield Primary Academy Behaviour Policy - Covid-19 amendments**

**(Updated June 2020)**

The safety and wellbeing of our pupils and staff is of paramount importance. In light of schools reopening partially on June 1<sup>st</sup>, The DFE have set out guidelines which recommend (where possible) social distancing, effective handwashing routines and adherence to good hygiene practices. At Westfield primary Academy, we have the highest expectations of all our pupils and alongside our current values and school promise we expect to see children:

- Adhering to the staggered start and finish times for their bubble
- Lining up on the socially distanced marking for all transitions
- Using exterior doors only to transition round the building
- Washing their hands throughout the day in line with the robust timetable which encourages ample opportunities to wash hands. Hands should be washed with soap and water for 20 seconds and hand sanitisers are accessible in every class
- Follow, in the event of sneezing or coughing, the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' and avoid touching their mouth, nose and eyes with their hands
- Avoid sharing food and equipment
- Remaining in their own class bubble at break and lunchtime
- Not touching any other pupil apart from a sibling who may be in the same bubble
- following the clear instructions given by the adults working with them

Children who continue to adhere to our school promise, our values and the expectations above will be rewarded with component coins, postcards home and be recognised in public situations like assemblies.

At Westfield, we recognise that some children will find adhering to the above more challenging. We are continuing to offer bespoke support and access to THRIVE intervention, sports coaching, remote noise solution sessions and 1;1 LSA support where needed. However, if children are unable to respect the priorities we have in place, we will have to consider:

1. A reduction to the current timetable, or
2. Time at home to reflect and consider what is important to keep the school community safe. A pupil can only return to school when the Headteacher is satisfied that safety measures can be fully respected.
